★ News from Kusafiri!

Several momentous events scheduled for this year at our fifth World Center, Kusafiri in Ghana.

April 30 – May 8 **U4SDGS Climax Event**

At the climax of the United Sustainable Development Goals (U4SDGs) project, a global initiative, Kusafiri will host the event for young women aged 18-24 who have been selected to attend. This 5-day event will showcase their successes, provide opportunities for networking with community partners, and feature insightful presentations from leading experts advancing the SDGs.

July 8 – 18 **Huduma kwa Utamaduni**

Huduma kwa Utamaduni is a Swahili phrase meaning – supporting others with kindness while celebrating cultural diversity. Join a team of passionate global volunteers to engage in maintenance and creative projects that will prepare Kusafiri for the upcoming season! You will also have the opportunity to explore Ghana’s rich culture, build connections with Girl Guides and Girl Scouts from around the world, and develop your leadership skills. This is your opportunity to contribute to Kusafiri’s history as the World Centre develops and prepares to host guests from around the world in 2025 and 2026.

September 1 – 8 **Shai Moonlight Adventure (Camping in the Wild)**

Come to Ghana and experience Kusafiri and explore Shai Hills, one of Ghana’s numerous beautiful nature reserves, located just a few hours away from the capital, Accra. The first night will be spent at Kusafiri, followed by travel to Shai the next day for a 3-day adventure. During the trip, you will be surrounded by nature, spending your days walking around the reserve and camping there at night. This is an exciting opportunity for you to discover more of Ghana while challenging yourself and reconnecting with the environment. Participants will

then return to Kusafiri for the closing and pinning ceremony. Open to ages 16+ and welcomes community members, families, and adventurous individuals.

October 1 – 21 **Community Adventures** (three weeks)

Embark on a transformative three-week adventure in Ghana, combining leadership development with cultural exploration and community engagement. Partner with local organizations, immerse yourself in Ghanaian culture and explore Accra and beyond while contributing to impactful projects.

- ✓ Train and certify at least two facilitators per Member Organisation in these three regions.
- ✓ Spark collaboration and knowledge-sharing among facilitators, strengthening leadership in local contexts.
- ✓ Embed the Girl Guide and Girl Scout leadership model, shaping the future of young leaders everywhere.

This is just the beginning! By 2026, we aim to extend training and certification opportunities to all WAGGGS learning and development teams, including World Centre volunteers and staff. ★ **Sangam’s Kaleidoscope Silk Scarf**

On October the 16th 2026 Sangam World Centre will celebrate its 60th birthday – its diamond jubilee! Between now and then, the Friends of Sangam will be building towards the celebration of these 60 years of changing lives.

We will be using a Mandala created by Julie Dawson, an artist who has been an advocate for Girl Scouts for many years, as our symbol of moving forward. A mandala is a geometric design that is often circular and uses

repeating patterns. The word "mandala" comes from Sanskrit and means "circle".

Julie’s mandala is a journey, starting from the outside through layers to the inner core. It starts from the arches of the Sangam building on the outside edge taking one on a pathway through a myriad of experiences at Sangam, as it leads one to our sister Girl Guides and Girl Scouts, united as one at the Sangam symbol in the center. The layers include the 50th Anniversary flower logo, Sangelee elephant representing strength and power, women wearing Saris, Mehendi designs among other images.

★ **Holi Festival**

Sangam World Center events provide participants with a variety of different themes. The themes include those featuring Culture, Leadership Development, Wellness, and even Celebration events. One such Cultural event happens in the Spring and is called Celebrate Holi and will be held this year on March 10 – 16, 2025

Holi, widely known as the Hindu festival of colors, is an annual celebration during the spring with cultural and religious significance. The festival celebrates love and signifies a time of rebirth and rejuvenation — a time to embrace the positive and let go of negative energy.

On the day of Holi, streets and towns are filled with people who throw colored powder in the air. Some fling

balloons filled with colored water and others use squirt guns. Cries of “Holi hai!” which means “It’s Holi!” can be heard on the streets.

The colors seen during Holi symbolize different things. Blue represents the color of Lord Krishna’s skin while green symbolizes spring and rebirth. Red symbolizes marriage or fertility while both red and yellow — symbolize auspiciousness.



Special foods are part of the celebration. The most popular food during Holi is “gujia,” a flaky, deep-fried sweet pastry stuffed with milk curd, nuts, and dried fruits. A cold drink “thandai” is prepared with a mix of almonds, fennel seeds, rose petals, poppy seeds, saffron, milk and sugar. Is also served.

★ **Discoveree 2025 – Friends of Sangam members share ways to the World Centres with Girl Scouts of Northern California**

Lady Baden-Powell stated in her message at the opening of Sangam in 1966 “love through knowledge and understanding,”. this will be carried out in full measure by the young people who will fill this place, and it is with deep joy in my heart that I declare Sangam open.” Two members of Friends of Sangam recently endeavored to share this spirit with about 20 adults Girl Scout Volunteers at the Girl Scouts of Northern California’s annual learning and enrichment event known as Discoveree.

Becky Simpson and Michelle Luster lead a session focused on WAGGGS and the World Centres to inspire leaders and adult volunteers to visit the World Centres and troops, to learn about the global Movement, to

connect with sister Girl Guides and Girl Scouts, global travel and to offer something only available through the WAGGGS member organizations and its more than more than ten million sisters.

In addition, there were booking and planning resources provided by the World Centres as well as suggestions for travel training and other tips to be sure girls and troops get the most out of their travel to a World Centre.

Dhamayanthy Pathmanathan, another Friend of Sangam presented an informative slide show about WAGGGS, World Thinking Day, and the five world Centers (Our Chalet, Pax Lodge, Nuestra Cabaña, Sangam and Kusafiri) which included magnificent photos and many data points.

The participants varied from relatively new volunteers to leaders who were helping their girls to plan for Senior and Ambassador trips, as well as two very special students. The first, Mary Jane Strom, the interim CEO for Girl Scouts of Northern California, a long time Girl Scout and an active learner who participated in the discussions with interest and engagement. The second, a Friend of Nuestra Cabaña, Barbie Novak, pictured, with 70 years plus in Girl Scouting, has traveled to Nuestra Cabaña almost every year since 2000.

Barbie offered suggestions for visiting with adults or with a troop, and provided so much inspiration to everyone with her cheerful spirits



The class ended with many questions and plans for traveling, so we hope to see many of these students at Sangam or another World Centre soon!

Many Friends gathered, in-person and virtually, at the Macy Gathering in late October-early November and elected co-chairs and co-vice chairs: Maureen Lienau and Sarah Edwards were elected to continue as permanent co-chairs with Barbara Johnson continuing as co-vice chair and Lisa Ferreira newly elected as co-vice chair. This slate was approved by the Board of Directors in December.

We also agreed on our annual donation goal and recruitment of new Friends. With fundraising in mind, we hosted a virtual tour on February 8, on Juliette Gordon Low in Grosvenor Square, researched and presented by our Honorary FoPL, Catherine Gritz and raised over \$1300. We will be hosting many new and interesting virtual fundraisers in the near future so please stay tuned.

Pax Lodge has undergone many updates and renovations in the past year, involving improvements of showers, pump systems, and radiator temperature controls – all to enhance the quality of the guest experience while staying at Pax Lodge. Additionally, we have renamed some of the rooms to reflect the World Centres: Our Chalet, Nuestra Cabaña, Sangam, and Kusafiri. Lodging at Pax Lodge continues to do well with 17,569 overnight guests in 2024.

With our Service Project Committee, we will welcome 38 women from the Cuernavaca VAMOS program for a day of fun and relaxation. The mission of the VAMOS is “to partner with Mexico’s poor by offering educational and job opportunities, along with basic human services, in a culture of love and respect for all.” Each woman will enjoy lunch with the FNC and be sent home with a bag of basic hygiene necessities.

The Themes and Ceremonies Committee will coordinate tree plantings for our 25-year members and memorials for FNC who we lost this last year.

The FNC have one year remaining on our three-year Save Our Cabaña Pledge Campaign and are optimistic that Nuestra Cabaña is continuing on a successful path of reopening.

We are also working with the World Foundation to launch an Endowment to protect Nuestra Cabaña for generations to come. More information to follow.

USA OB-PS

2024 was a spectacular year for the Olave Baden-Powell Society (OB-PS), the individual-giving arm of WAGGGS fundraising. We celebrated our 40th anniversary and our membership increased to over 1,800 people worldwide. More OB-PS Members provides an increased ability to support WAGGGS-sponsored programs to girls and young women around the world, including programs at the World Centres. Your USA team set a goal of “25 in 2025” (25 new Members in 2025) and you are invited to join us in reaching, and hopefully exceeding, this goal. OB-PS President Kaela Sáenz Oriti and our Board Members are looking towards the WAGGGS centennial in 2028 and the actions we can take to make WAGGGS financially sustainable for the next 100 years.

We know that “Together We Rise” and can collectively make an incredible impact.

An example of the support that OB-PS provides for WAGGGS are the Juliette Low Seminars (JLS) that are “powered by OB-PS.” JLS is the global leadership program of WAGGGS. In 2024, 150 girls and young women from 70 countries participated in a JLS program that was delivered in all four official WAGGGS languages. Each participant was challenged to implement a “100 Girls Project” to support girl leadership in their local community and to put their learning into action for a ripple effect of the impact. Many of the participant’s projects greatly surpassed their commitment of reaching 100 girls. In addition to the JLS sessions, OB-PS assisted in financing other WAGGGS programs around the world about STEM, environmental awareness, mental health and well-being, and many others.

One JLS participant from the USA stated, “Peacebuilding now feels less abstract to me and more rooted in everyday actions. I’ve come to understand it as fostering relationships, addressing misunderstandings, and creating spaces where diverse voices are heard and respected.”

Jordan, one of the USA participants, implemented a project focused on teaching girls’ mental health skills to foster inner peace. Her project encouraged reflection, leadership, and mental wellness, contributing to targeted goals of Good Health and Well-Being, Quality Education, and Peace, Justice, & Strong Institutions. In Mableton, Georgia, she led activities that helped girls develop resilience and create “confidence rocks” as symbols of their growth. Jordan reached 144 girls and young women, empowering them to share these skills within their communities. Jordan said, “They learned that inner peace is something that you can work on by having skills that you can use and put in your toolbox for future use to make it easier to have peace and teach it.”

Reflecting on 2024

2024 was a year where WAGGGS continued to reinforce its commitment to girls and young women,

whether through unique leadership programmes to support girls and young women to not just be the leaders of tomorrow, but as leaders today or supporting over 100 Member Organisations to be stronger and more resilient in delivering quality girl guiding and girl scouting experiences. Equally, WAGGGS continued to offer a range of global programmes supporting over one million girls and young women to act as leaders and advocates on critical global challenges that matter to them, from climate change and peace building to gender based violence, body confidence, period pride and STEM education, empowering them to shape the future of our planet and its people.

One of the highlights of 2024 was WAGGGS Surf Smart 2.0 cybersecurity and cyber awareness program, which reached over 850,000 young people in more than 100 countries. This initiative empowers girls to navigate the internet safely, advocate for their rights, and lead confidently in a digital world. At the same time, WAGGGS's Free Being Me programme, focused on body confidence and self-esteem, reached over 8 million young people, helping girls embrace who they are and join the movement toward a world free from appearance-related anxiety.

On 9th December we celebrated JLS 2024 Closing Ceremony.

The JLS 2024 programme closed, and we couldn't be prouder of what we've accomplished together. Over the past year, volunteers and staff from across our global movement have worked tirelessly to deliver an inspiring and impactful leadership experience for young women, who are now working on impact in their own communities through their peace-themed 100 Girls Projects.

Looking Ahead to 2025

World Thinking Day 2025 22nd February - This year's theme is 'Our Story'. You will have the chance to reflect on the symbolism and values of WAGGGS

and explore what it has meant to be a Girl Guide and Girl Scout over the years. You will be travelling into the past, exploring present-day, and looking towards the future. Together, we can look towards the future and write our own story ensuring that we create a space where every girl feels empowered and safe to be themselves.

The year 2025 promises to offer even more exciting opportunities for girls and young women worldwide. WAGGGS is launching STEM Changemakers, a global initiative focused on inspiring girls in the Asia-Pacific region to explore careers in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). With new programmes and a digital STEM hub, WAGGGS aims to empower girls and young women to build their agency to challenge the barriers and stigmas associated with girls developing an interest in STEM education and careers, making STEM accessible to all. 2025 will also see WAGGGS working with a new network of young women Global Advocacy Champions who will participate in the 69th UN Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) in March. This is a unique opportunity for Girl Guides and Girl Scouts to advocate for the rights of girls and young women at a global level, and champion gender equality through the principal global intergovernmental body shaping global policy standards on women's rights. Each Global Advocacy Champion will represent the concerns of girls and young women from their national Girl Guiding or Scouting association and the diverse range of countries where they are from.

WAGGGS global programmes reached over one million girls and young women, enabling them to become powerful advocates for issues they care about—from climate change and peacebuilding to gender equality, body confidence, period pride, and STEM education. These young leaders are shaping the future of our planet and its people, and we are proud to support them every step of the way.

Between June and August 5 Regional Conferences will take place to focus on regional governance matters and elect new Regional Committee's.

World Centres 2024 Update

Our World Centres continue to play a pivotal role in empowering young women, fostering leadership, and promoting cultural exchange. Here are some key highlights from 2024:

- 6,000+ Girl Guides and Girl Scouts have visited our Centres.
- 100+ scholarships and travel grants have been awarded to young women, enabling them to gain invaluable experiences.
- 90 volunteers from over 30 countries have contributed their time and skills.
- 1,076 participants engaged in our STEM Discovery Day Programme.
- 49 events delivered across various Centres, connecting communities globally.

Impactful Stories: Looking Back

In September 2014, Our Chalet hosted the Alpine Adventure Week, an exciting event for young alum to come explore the beautiful Alpine region, learn about Swiss culture, and make global connections with an International Festival. I was fortunate to be able to attend as a recent graduate thanks to scholarship and travel funding provided by the World Foundation.

I still tell stories a decade later of the breathtaking vistas and adrenaline-inducing mountain activities, but what really changed my life were the connections I made while there. Among the many incredible young people I shared this experience with were two particularly impactful individuals.

Australian Girl Guide Amy M. became a friend for life. The bond we formed in just 7 shared days at Our Chalet led to shared travel on two different continents, exchange of many Girl Scout and Girl Guide stories, and countless lessons learned through one another or beside one another. And it all started high up, high on a mountain.



I am also so honored to have shared space with an incredible young woman from the Maldives Girl Guides Association who has been deeply active and giving within her home organization and WAGGGS on a whole, even earning a seat as a Committee Member on the current Asia Pacific Regional Committee. Fira brought so much joy to the event in Adelboden and truly excelled in activities outside of her comfort zone. At the International Festival, she and Reem, a fellow Maldives Girl Guide, gave me a perspective shift that has stayed with me ever since. To this day I think of them when I take certain steps to make the world a better place. Especially in relation to climate action, they lit a fire in me that has never dulled.

There is no end to my gratitude for my time with this event and the people I built those memories with. How beautiful it is to now be able to do so much for the very Foundation that got me there.
