

Treasurer's FY23 Fundraising Report

Fundraising activity was strong in September as we came to the end of the fiscal year. Friends Committees in September raised \$86,079, which is 50% more than last September. For the full fiscal year, Friends Committees raised \$303,533, 10% below last fiscal year. Our Cabaña, Sangam and Pax Lodge exceeded their goals for the year, while Our Chalet and WAGGGS USA fell short of their ambitious goals.

WAGGGS Development Fund is 6% ahead of last year. Giving to Global Initiatives increased by 17% as Board members were directed to this fund over the WF Operating Fund, which was already well funded coming into the year. Overall, without the Save Our Cabaña Funds (the Campaign and Endowment), fundraising was down 6% over FY22.

Updates from the Board:

The Board of Directors of the World Foundation for Girl Guides and Girl Scouts. Inc. recently held two Board Meetings. August 23, 2023 the Board met with leadership of WAGGGS to review new applications and receive updates about previous grant funding. The Board met September 11, 2023 and approved \$ 653,213 grant funding for WAGGGS Giving Day - Leadership **Development Resources; WAGGGS** Development Fund – Giving Day supporting Turkey, assisting MOs and along with OB-PS funding from Cincinnati 2022 meeting the Young Facilitators at World Conference; Save Our Cabaña Campaign; International Day supporting 16 Days of Activism and

Conference on Status of Women; Global Girls Leadership Program and Handbooks.

Nuestra Cabaña quietly celebrated her 66th Birthday on July 24th with very little fanfare.

A little history:

In 1952, following approval by the World Board to explore options for a World Centre in the Western Hemisphere, a committee was formed to select a name for the new World Centre. The names proposed were:

- Nuestra Casita
- Nuestro Ranchito
- Nuestra Cabaña

The committee decided on... Nuestra Cabaña meaning our little cabin. Over the years, many of us referred to our beloved World Centre as Our Cabaña. Now, with reopening in sight, WAGGGS has requested she once again correctly be called Nuestra Cabaña.

Friends enjoyed our time at the GSUSA national convention, sharing our stories and encouraging troops to start planning a trip to Nuestra Cabaña. We also spoke with several women interested in becoming Friends.

In October, a group of FOC will travel to Cuernavaca for a Renewal Event working together to reopen the Chief's Door. We will be using elbow grease to clean, unpack stored away treasures, and plan for the future.

The FOC continues to work with WAGGGS and Martha Concha, new World Centre Manager for Nuestra Cabaña, to ensure a successful reopening of Nuestra Cabaña.



We will hold our annual meeting at Nuestra Cabaña February 7 – 11, 2024 and welcome three new FOC. With Mariachis and dancing, we will celebrate Nuestra Cabaña's Reopening, her upcoming 67th Birthday and the Friends 66th Anniversary. This will be a celebration of the hard work of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts over decades to create and sustain Nuestra Cabaña – the "Place Where Dreams Come True".

World Foundation + USA Girl Scouts Overseas: Connecting girls, the world over!

A sincere USA Girl Scouts Overseas (USAGSO) thank you, to the World Foundation!

This year, the World Foundation's generosity brought Girl Scout organization back to Mexico City, provided micro grants to individual USAGSO communities to host their own events, funded online expansion and increased visibility, and for the first time in three years, got USAGSO girls back together at camp! In June of 2023, over 100 USAGSO members (including over 75 youth members) gathered at Our Chalet in Switzerland to learn about one another, the outdoors, and themselves. The theme was GLOW: Girls Leading Our World. Nowhere is the mission of USAGSO and the World Foundation more tangible than when girls from around the world work together towards a better future for all global citizens.

After camp, when asked, the majority of respondents shared that their girls were more confident in themselves, confident in making healthy relationships, as well as more likely to take healthy risks and show empathy towards others. Also, 93% of respondents said they would be interested in visiting another World Center, thanks to their experience at Our Chalet.

Get Ready for Governance #PoweredbyOBPS

In October 2022 at the OB-PS Annual Event in Ohio, OB-PS Members gave

generously to give young women attending the World Conference an opportunity to gain new skills and prepare them to get the most out of their governance experience.



The young women named this event 'Get Ready for Governance Powered by OB-PS' and on 25th July in Larnaca Cyprus, this event took place.

The support of OB-PS Members enabled 108 young women from 61 Member Organisations to participate. This event was also supported by 3 young women from WAGGGS Regional Committees and 12 young women from Girl Guides Association Cyprus.



The young women on this journey started to **DREAM** through two online webinars prior to the in-person event. In these sessions they could both got to know WAGGGS Governance, rules and procedures and connect with peers attending the conference, growing, and strengthening their global connections.

They began to **ACT** as they attended the in-person pre-event in Larnaca, Cyprus. They took part in sessions including networking, understanding the World Conference, the World Conference and you, and action planning. Before ending the day with a welcome beach party hosted by the Girl Guide Association of Cyprus.



Following this eventful day the young women were ready to **LEAD** as they began to actively participate in the World Conference and use their voice to represent girls and young women across the Girl Guide and Girl Scout Movement. Participation tracking in all plenary sessions captured the number of youth participants who spoke vs those over 30, with over 60% of speakers in plenary being under 30 years of age!



The young women have reconnected after the World Conference for the final part of the program, the **FUTURE IS**

OURS. They met online to reflect on their experience and share the learnings they plan to apply in the future.

WAGGGS launches its first STEM Programme

WAGGGS is delighted to launch a brand-new partnership with the Johnson & Johnson Foundation to encourage girls and young women to pursue careers in Science Technology Engineering & Mathematics (STEM).

Earlier in 2023, with the support of the Johnson & Johnson Foundation, WAGGGS held a first ever series of STEM webinars. The series reached an amazing audience of over 6,000 young people and the feedback received from the webinars was extremely positive. It was clear that young people from the WAGGGS Global Movement would love to see WAGGGS introduce STEM as part of the WAGGGS Global Programme offering.



Following this feedback, WAGGGS is delighted to launch our first STEM programme. With the continued support of the Johnson & Johnson Foundation, the programme will be delivered at Sangam World Centre in India.

Thanks to the creative, collaborative team efforts of our Friends Committees, the World Foundation was able to provide girls and adults with a variety of fun, interactive, and informative activities that helped them learn more about the world centres and the shared international aspect of Girl Scouting and Girl Guiding.

Nestled within our 1,000 square feet of prime real estate in the Hall of Experiences were six activities, all planned and executed by our Friends Committees. Participants received a passport that encouraged them to visit all six stations. Once their passport was full, they were able to receive a very "cool" sticker. The Friends of Our Cabaña, led by Barbara Putney and Patty Cook, had a colorful display that helped girls learn about the fun activities awaiting them in Cuernavaca as well as important information about the migration of monarch butterflies and how climate change is endangering this important natural phenomenon.



The Friends of Our Chalet, led by Mary Williams and Leilani Wilmore, allowed girls to envision themselves having fun at Our Chalet thanks to a large photobooth experience. Armed with signs pointing the way and lots of props, girls and adults had a fantastic time imagining themselves high up, high on the mountain.



Thanks to the creative, out of the box thinking of the Friends of Pax Lodge, girls had the chance to interact with an "escape room". This popular activity was created by Barbara Johnson, Sarah Edwards, and Lisa Ferreira. Using a 10' x 10' tent frame, some twinkling lights, and some creative side panels, Friends of Pax Lodge created an experience where girls learned about this world center, traveling to London, and the fun that awaits them.



When girls used their passports to travel to Sangam, they learned all about the mystery and magic of henna. Big thanks go out to Wendie Wu and Michelle Luster who led the

efforts for Friends of Sangam. An added benefit was that Uzma Khan, Guest Services and Operations Coordinator at Sangam, was in the booth sharing her enthusiasm and passion for all things Sangam. Girls were thrilled to meet Uzma and adults took full advantage to have many of their questions answer "by a pro."

The three trefoil leaves represent the three-fold promise: "To serve God and my country, to help people at all times, and to live by the Girl Scout Law."



Friends of WAGGGS USA oversaw the passport and sticker distribution all while helping girls learn the meaning of the different parts of our World Association pin. This was just one of the "symbols of unity" that Girl Scouts and Girl Guides share and which girls got to learn about as they visited the different areas within our collective space.
