Friends of WAGGGS USA

Friends of WAGGGS USA has proudly supported the WAGGGS Initiative "Stop the Violence," the world's only global campaign to stop all violence against girls and women.

SPEAKING OUT AND TAKING ACTION is a critical Stop the Violence campaign component. Since its launch in

2011, Girl Guides and Girl Scouts have advocated for ending violence against girls and women in their communities, counties, and worldwide. During 16 Days of Activism, WAGGGS has mobilized thousands of young women worldwide as part of campaigns like #OurStreetsToo, #GirlsAreUnsafe, and #OurStreetToo.

STV is now active in 70 COUNTRIES, with 35 countries delivering the VAV (Voices Against Violence) curriculum in four different languages – English, French, Spanish, and Arabic.

WAGGGS has directly trained more than 200 National Trainers, who then went on to train more than 7,000 leaders in their own countries.

80,000 young people have completed the VAV curriculum so far, and donations have been critical to the success of the "Stop the Violence" campaign!

FoWAGGGS USA welcomes our newest members, Joanne Fischer from Pennsylvania and Nayeli Zayas from Cuernavaca, Mexico, approved at the WF Board meeting on March 4, 2023.

JoAnne Fischer is retired after 30 years of heading a maternal child health NGO. She is a lifetime member of GSUSA, was a girl participant at Our Cabana,

News from the Members:



World Foundation + USA Girl Scouts Overseas: Connecting girls, the world over!

Through the generosity of the World Foundation and its supporters, USAGSO is doing remarkable things in 2023, giving structure and opportunity to our members.

Virtual programming continues to engage and challenge; and this year we are proud to bring back residential camp, in partnership with <u>Our Chalet World Centre!</u>
Because of the World Foundation's connections and support, USAGSO will host over 75 youth and 16 adult members at Our Chalet in early June.

Finally, as in years past, Community Camp Grants provided by the World Foundation have been invaluable in reinvigorating and rebuilding USAGSO communities. Here are some examples of the camps supported by the World Foundation:

In Addis Ababa, Ethiopia -

"We spent 2 nights at the Embassy run campground on Langano Lake. The [Girl] Scout patrols (5 different patrols) were each responsible for one meal (planning and preparing) and one cleaning up after a meal. The Brownies and Juniors practiced their campfire skills. All Scouts learned about the Leave No Trace principles and actively employed them for future campers at the campground. The Patrols performed skits, and all had S'Mores."



In Wiesbaden, Germany -

"This [Zombie preparedness] event was hosted by Cadette Troop 102. Cadette Troop 102 developed the outline and station plans for the event, created the decor, and led some of the stations. Cadettes from Troop 102 as well as 2 Cadette Juliettes led the remaining stations. (All under adult supervision, of course.) The objective of the event was to teach emergency preparedness skills to the younger (Daisy-Junior) Girl Scouts."





In Japan -

"This was an island wide camporee that was attended by Camp Courtney, Camp Kinser, Camp Foster and Kadena Girl Scouts. Japanese Girl Scouts were also in attendance."



In Shanghai, China -

"World Thinking Day event, attended by troops from Concordia, YCIS, Xuhui Mix Troops and French Girl Guides. The flag ceremony was the first time for some troops, it was beautiful to see all the flags from different troop levels. It was great to see other troops from different schools as well, makes it feel like part of a big community. It was also inspiring to see older girls lead a workshop. The Xuhui Mix Troop performed a short skit/play. The friendship circle and singing the "Make new friends song" were a crowd favorite. Of course, the SWAPS was something our girls always look forward to. It was nice to see younger kids interact with the older girls."





In Paris, France -

"Archery tag was a great success at camp in! We had two sessions. One for Cadettes and above and one for Juniors. We had completed Think Like a Citizen Scientist on Saturday and the girls had a karaoke dance that evening and after breakfast they were ready for archery. It was a

fantastic workshop where they learned how to shoot modified arrows and then got to play tag and shoot 'arrows' at each other. The kids and adults really enjoyed it."

The trust of the World Foundation has given USAGSO the agility and guidance to keep members of the Movement at the center of all that we do. With your support and leadership, USAGSO can be wherever our members are, when they need us most.

WAGGGS STEM Consultation

More girls are in school today than ever before, but they do not always have the same opportunities as boys to complete and benefit from



an education of their choice. Too many girls and women are held back by biases, social norms and expectations young womer influencing the quality of the education they receive and the subjects they study. They are particularly and build a under-represented in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education, and consequently in STEM careers. WAGGGS vital young women develop skills and build a better world!



WAGGGS STEM consultation engaged over 8,500 young participants from over 50 countries around the world. The survey provided

insight into barriers to girls and young women and STEM careers.

60% of respondents felt more males opted to pursue STEM at school, university or tertiary level in their country. These barriers include culture-related bias and a lack of confidence, among others, preventing girls and young women from careers in STEM.

69% told us girls lack confidence in taking up STEM subjects, and 72% feel they don't get the support and encouragement they need from adults.

65% of our national Member Organisations said that in their countries, girls are simply not being told about the career choices they can make after studying STEM subjects.

World Thinking Day 2023

Over 168 million steps were taken, more than doubling the target, and £21,000 raised so far. These are the fantastic results of the Global Movement coming together to participate in the WAGGGS Walk the World Challenge 2023.

The challenge which ran for two months, starting on World Thinking Day 2023 and finishing on Earth Day 2023 has been a great success in re-invigorating the WAGGGS World Thinking Day fund which will support WAGGGS vital work to empower over 8 million girls and young women in 152 countries to grow in confidence,

develop skills and build a better world! A huge thank you to everybody who got involved and made the challenge such a success by walking, fundraising, and donating.

Global Youth Mobilization (GYM)

An estimated 1.2 billion young people have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic response measures. Disruptions to education, employment, health services and social support have changed the future of an entire generation.

To address these challenges, the world's largest Big Six youth organizations (Including WAGGGS) initiated the GYM to harness the surge of youth-led activism and action, creative solutions, passion, and commitment, by investing much needed funds at a grassroots level and advocating for the role of young people in COVID-19 recovery and response efforts.

On the 27th March, the Global Youth Mobilization (GYM) launched its final impact report. Titled "Unstoppable Together: Celebrating 2 Years of Youth-led Global Action" the report highlights the reach and impact of the investment in young people globally to date.

To address challenges faced by an estimated 1.2 billion young people around the world as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the world's largest Big Six youth organizations initiated the GYM to harness the surge of youth-led activism and action, creative solutions, passion, and commitment, by investing much needed funds at a grassroots level and advocating for the role of young people in COVID-19 recovery and response efforts.

To date the GYM has invested \$5 million in supporting 471 youth-led projects in 72 countries. The final report represents the success of the Big Six's collaboration and partnership on a global scale and the importance of implementing new and accessible funding opportunities for young people. The report includes case studies of global youth-led projects and makes a series of recommendations to multinational institutions, governments, policymakers, and corporations to ensure that the needs of young people are prioritised in future decisions.

The World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts and Unilever's Dove Self-Esteem Project (DESP) have been recognised for their unique ten-year global programme Free Being Me at this year's Better Society Awards.

The Better Society Awards recognizes organisations that are helping to create a better, more equal, world for all and this year The World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS) and Unilever's Dove Self-Esteem Project (DESP) received the Highly Commended Award for a 'Partnership with an International Charity'. The award celebrates a transformational global programme empowering millions of young people through improving body-confidence and self-esteem.

This year is an incredible milestone for the Free Being Me programme which has for 10 years empowered young people through improving body-confidence and
